

# Our Lady of Mt Carmel Sacramental Program 2018

for children



Participation in the Orientation Evening is essential into any Sacramental Program here in the Parish. Preparation Sessions will be held on Tuesday evenings from 6.30pm to 7.30pm in the Parish Centre, 230 Humphries Road, Bonnyrigg. **Children must be accompanied by a parent/guardian at all times during the sessions.** Sessions begin promptly at 6.30pm with a prayer.

Children will be accepted for enrolment in the following order:

**Baptism** - As an infant or a child. **Reconciliation** - In Year 2 or higher

**First Holy Communion** - In Year 3 or higher. **Confirmation** - In Year 6 or higher.

(Adult Confirmation preparation is separate - please call Office for details)

## The Sacrament of Baptism (School Aged Children)

It is never too late! If you are a Catholic parent and have not baptised your child yet but wish to do so, call the Parish Office for more information. Two short preparation classes are held for the children receiving the Sacrament of Baptism. Parents need to attend classes with their child or as a family with the child's siblings.

The first session is the story of Jesus' Baptism and the signs and symbols of Baptism.

The second session is a tour of the insides of OLMC Church, its pictures, statues, furnishings and the Baptism area.

If your child is enrolled in a State School which has the benefit of Scripture (SRE) classes, it is expected that your child should attend the Scripture classes.

Baptisms for School age children will take place on Saturday 12th May at 11am and Saturday 8th September at 11.00am.

Confirmation are important and wonderful times in your child's faith journey. Preparing to celebrate the Sacraments starts in the home, in our families. Parents, as the first mentors of faith, have a significant role to accompany their children as they deepen their relationship with God.



## Sacrament of Confirmation

### Who can receive the Sacrament of Confirmation:

Children in Year 6 or higher who have been baptised, and have received First Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

Enrolment fee: \$20 (Payable at registration).

### Registration/Orientation evening:

Orientation on Tuesday 15th May at 6.30pm in the Church. Following orientation, registration will take place in the Parish hall at 7.00pm.



Children are not required to attend. On this night, please bring your child's Baptism, Reconciliation and Communion certificates.

**The sponsor you choose** should be a practising Catholic, over the age of 16 years and have received all their Sacraments of Initiation, including Confirmation. Sponsors are to be models of Christian living, regularly attending Mass and receiving the Eucharist. You may think about choosing one of your Godparents from your Baptism as a sponsor.

### Who can receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion:

Children in Year 3 or higher who have been baptised and have received First Reconciliation.

Enrolment fee: \$20 (Payable at Orientation).

### Registration/Orientation evening:

Tuesday 31st July at 6.30pm. Children are not required to attend. On this night, please bring your child's Baptism and Reconciliation certificates.

Following registration there will be a meeting in the Church at 7.00pm.

### Altar Server Training

Every year the Parish will run some training sessions for Altar Servers.

Please ring the Parish Office for dates and times. Children can enrol in the

Altar Server training courses once they have received the Sacrament of

First Holy Communion. Altar Servers (boys and girls) assist the priest at

the altar by carrying the Processional Cross, carrying the candles, holding the Liturgical books, bringing the water and towel, ringing the bells and so on. Training is usually held on a Saturday in the Church and parents **must** stay with their child at training.
